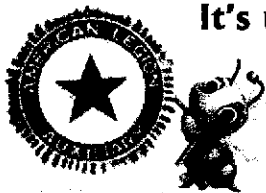

Anyone not renewed before 1 Jan 2026 loses all privileges of our Legion Hall – Lounge and Kitchen – nor will you have privileges at any other American Legion Hall or VFW. National considers those not renewed before the beginning of the calendar year (in this case 2026) “members not in good standing”; as such your record is marked with possibility of losing all the saving benefits issued by National. Information on these National Benefits were sent to you when you first joined, and up-dates are available on the National website [ALAforVeterans.org](http://ALAforVeterans.org). Of Course, the biggest loss is the financial support each renewal gives to our programs for veterans and scholarships for students. Then there's the loss of strength behind our leadership when they address Congress on behalf of the Legislative Priorities declared to benefit veterans and our military. . What do we need to do and/or say to impress upon everyone the need for renewals to be submitted **before** Veterans Day for the biggest positive impact? As the Membership Chairman for Unit 28, it's my responsibility to encourage renewals in as early in the term as possible, help members understand their benefits, and to also promote new member applications. Last month, as much as I didn't like doing it – those not renewed were listed in the newsletter in an effort to remind and to enlist the assistance of everybody in getting renewals paid. Unit 28 invited the Almira/Coulee/Hartline, Ephrata, Quincy, Soap Lake, and Wilson Creek School Districts as well as New Life Christian School, St Rose of Lima Catholic School, and any homeschoolers residing in those school districts to participate. The contest is for Grades 3-12 as well as a Special Needs class. The details were provided to each school and published in local newspapers last fall and a reminder sent out in December. This year's title is "Celebrating America's 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday and the Veterans Who Fought for Our Freedom." We've discovered in the past, no matter how much we do to get the information distributed in the schools and provided to the public – someone says, "didn't know anything about it".
