ABC's For Members

ATTEND your Unit/Post/Squadron, District, and Department Meetings

BE a working member – a few hours monthly will qualify you.

CHECK out the facts before repeating things told to you. DON'T walk between the flag and banner or between chairman and speaker.

EXPRESS yourself freely and honestly AT meetings – NOT AFTER!

FAMILIARIZE yourself with each program (especially membership).

GIVE proper respect to all officers in their official capacity.

HAVE an adequate knowledge of parliamentary procedure.

IT is your duty to vote on matters, research the issues and vote what you feel is best (even though it may not be the most popular). Don't feel compelled to vote? Your silence indicates you favor the matter being voted on.

JOIN discussions at meetings. Join group activities. You will learn and have fun too!

KINDLE that spark of friendliness and enthusiasm within yourself.

Even if you don't agree with them. LISTEN to and respect the opinion of others.

Membership begins with ME. MEMBERSHIP is everyone's responsibility.

NO speaking across the floor to members – always go through the chair.

OBEY the rules of the organization.

PAY your dues on time - the earlier the better.

QUESTION reports and actions you don't fully understand. It's a learning experience, usually for more than just you.

REFRAIN from talking while business is being transacted or while speaker is speaking.

STUDY Unit/Post/Squadron, District, Department, and National Constitution/Bylaws and Standing Rules.

When you notify me, I'll send you the special thank you from your Unit 28, your card, and update our files.

Remember, we do Early Bird Stamps on your card — National does not.

Don't forget our special, during months of May-August! An Auxiliary Sr member (18 or over) applying for membership with Unit 28 can receive a \$6 discount by paying now, for both 2025 & 2026 membership years. So, if taking advantage of the special, the total amount to pay would be \$94.

July 2, 1788 - Congress announced the United States Constitution had been ratified.

July 2, 1926: The U.S. Army Air Corps was established.

July 4, 1776 - The Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress.

July 7, 1898 - President William McKinley annexed Hawaii.

July 9, 1868 - The 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified.

July 10, 1943 - The Allied invasion of Italy began with an attack on the island of Sicily.

Jul 10-13 - Department Convention (Spokane Valley)

July 16, 1945 - The experimental Atomic bomb "Fat Boy" was set off in New Mexico.

July 20, 1969 - Apollo 11 Astronaut Neil Armstrong took his first step onto the moon.

July 21, 1898 - Guam was ceded to the United States by Spain.

July 25, 1898 - During the Spanish-American War, the U.S. invaded Puerto Rico.

July 26, 1948 - President Harry Truman desegregated the armed forces.

July 27, 1953 - The Korean War effectively ended after 3 years with the signing of an armistice.

July 28, 1932 - Ordered by President Herbert Hoover, U.S. Army troops attacked and burned the encampments of 15,000 unemployed World War I veterans in Washington, D.C.
