Our annual Christmas Bake Sale will be held 16-20 Dec. Please make a donation for items to purchase. You may also bring donations of goodies to put on the sales table.


We will be closing early, at 4pm, on Christmas Eve, Dec 24th (so no Burger Nite) and will remain closed on Dec 25th – Christmas.



Recently, I've been busy trying to make a booklet showing all the collectible cars the Auxiliary received to support the Giff Shops we do in Spokane. The Auxiliary was blessed by a gentleman who'd managed to build quite a collection of model cars, in that when he passed away, he left the wish for the collection go to support the Giff Shops. So, as a co-chairman of these Giff Shops, I got about 9 moving boxes full of model cars, most in their original packaging. We'd decided the best way for the cars to properly support, was to sell them. So, to help with the sale of these very special cars, we unpacked all the cars and proceeded to put them into categories and took pictures. The pictures with a lettle caption description are being compiled into a booklet which be used to take to different businesses and put out on the internet in hope to raise money to make purchases that will fill a need for veterans and their families.

While moving cars around and taking pictures a few of the members in the Post asked what I was doing. When I explained we were organizing so we could sell the cars in support of Gift Shops and Veterans' Christmas Program, I was really puzzled that most of these people said they didn't know what Gift Shop was. So, I thought I'd publish then article I wrote last year defining Gift Shop, Vet's Christmas Program, and our participation in the programs.

GP Shop: Is a program going back to the very beginning of American Legion Auxiliary. In the 1920s, baspitalized veterans had no way to get a gift to give to their loved ones. The Auxiliary would set up a miniature Department Store in a spare room or similar space provided by the VA in the hospital. Then Auxiliary volunteers and/or hospital staff help the veterans in the "store" to pick out items for gifts to his her loved ones. The Auxiliary wraps all the gifts and put a stocker on the gift indicating who it is for and from whom (one of the reasons we ask what the kids and grandkids call the vet—so the sticker is close to normal as possible). In the present day, people don't spend as much time hospitalized and there are websites galore with opportunities to buy gifts. However, the Auxiliary continues the tradition because Veterans with a disability either financial or physical still need the help. Unit 28 gives financial support, through Department, to three gift shops, two in Spokane and one in Walla Walla. And, a few members give nears. The Gift Shops are only open for 2-3 days; but lots of volunteers are needed to be lips set up and assist veterans, shop, wang presents, and prepare for mailing.

We also support the Christmos Program, another long-time program where a gift is given to a visteria. Our participation is mainly at Spekane VAMC & Vets Home, and our local vets/military (we learn of through the Grant County) Service Officer and the VA Representative for Grant County). I hope to receive information on the needs of local veterans very soon. Once I have all the needs, we'll be putting special ornaments/tags on the little tree in the dining hall. No one will know the names of the individuals because I've asked the reps to assign a number to each vet and only the rep will know what number identifies which vet. We ask our members to please take a tag, purchase the item, wrap it and tape the tag on outside of the present. I'll have numbered totes by the service flags in the dining hall, the presents should be placed in the appropriate numbered tote before December 20*. To maintain your active status as a member, your renewal must be in and processed before Dec 15th to ensure enough time for full National processing.
