Although we lost a few dollars on food, due to the extreme price of crab this year, we made up for it with our extras. Namely the 50/50 raffle and the auction. Thanks to almost \$900.00 in donated supplies, we cleared approximately \$5,694.83 for the Crab Feed.

While the Legion Family was doing the Crab Feed the Club also did well, as expected. The bar took in a little over \$2,200.00 while pull tab sales exceeded \$3,300.00.

I want to thank everyone who helped, especially Linda Myers who handled the bulk of the preparations and served the crab.



We're very grateful to those who've renewed their membership for 2025. They are definitely on the right trail to accomplishing our mission of service to our veterans, military, their families, and communities. Nor are we able to properly support our other programs such as scholarships and providing patriotic learning materials to our schools & city libraries.


